New Updates

Abortion is safe and normal:

In regards to anti-choice protesters on campus: everyone has the right to their own opinion and freedom of expression. However, I understand that the anti-choice protestors can be upsetting, distressing and frustrating for many students, particularly with the use of graphic imagery. While the UM may allow these protestors the right to freedom of expression, they can be doing more to protect students and community members from the graphic, and often unsettling, material. The sandwich boards warning of graphic imagery are a good start, but we must continue to educate and prevent the spread of harmful disinformation about abortion.

Your body, your choice. The decision to get an abortion or to not get an abortion never has to be justified!

International student healthcare

Correspondence with Shared Health CEO has been made, and they are willing and eager to discuss international student healthcare overage with us. However, we have been told that they are waiting on the office of Minister Jon Reyes to schedule the meeting between us – a meeting that the Minister promised to arrange back in September 2022.

Manitoba Alliance of Post-Secondary Students (MAPSS)

MMIWG2S & working to address systemic racism and oppression:

On Dec.1, 2022, the Winnipeg Police Service announced that the homicides of Morgan Harris, Marcedes Myran, Rebecca Contois and Mashkode Bizhiki'ikwe, or Buffalo Woman were connected to the same perpetrator.

Since the announcement of the homicides being connected was made, many groups have called on all levels of government to do something about the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls & Two-Spirited people epidemic that is ongoing in Canada.

UMSU has sent letters calling on the municipal government to cease operations at both Prairie Green and Brady Landfills, and search immediately for the remains of those who are still missing.

We have also sent letters calling on the provincial government to urge the City of Winnipeg and the Winnipeg Police to search these sites and, further, for them to urge the federal government to declare a national state of emergency.

In addition to advocacy towards the municipal and provincial governments, we have sent letters calling on the federal government of Canada to declare a national emergency surrounding MMIWG2S.

These letters sent out to all levels of government were created/written by UMSU Indigenous Representative Ishkode Catcheway, UMISA Co-President Raven Morrisseau and myself.

UMSU Indigenous Representative Ishkode Catcheway, UMISA Co-President Raven Morrisseau and I, have been in contact with Deputy-Mayor & Chair of the Winnipeg Police Service Board Markus Chambers. Deputy-Mayor Chambers has stated that he wishes to continue to listen to the community and support community led efforts that improve safety for Indigenous people in Winnipeg. We are currently working on arranging a meeting where we will present recommendations to Deputy-Mayor Chambers for him to bring back to not only the city council but also the WPS. These recommendations will hopefully help to inform these systems on how meaningful reconciliation that is truly anti-colonial & community-led can be achieved in the future.
